December 19, 2021 – Monuments: Friends of Story

The twelve stones

God often chose monuments as a way for people to remember His stories. After crossing the Jordan River, the Children of Israel erected two different twelve stone monuments. One was in the middle of the Jordan and the other was in Gilgal. Joshua explained to the people why God wanted the stone monument built:

²¹"When your children ask their fathers in time to come, saying, 'What are these stones?' ²²then you shall let your children know, saying, 'Israel crossed over this Jordan on dry land'; ²³for the Lord your God dried up the waters of the Jordan before you until you had crossed over, as the Lord your God did to the Red Sea, which He dried up before us until we had crossed over, ²⁴that all the peoples of the earth may know the hand of the Lord, that it is mighty, that you may fear the Lord your God forever." (Joshua 4:21-24)

God knows that kids are curious creatures. No pile of stones was going to go unnoticed. This monument was probably built on a significant structure, making it even more noticeable. God also knows that kids don't sit on their curiosity, they ask questions. When the Israelites' children asked about the stones, their parents would have a perfect opportunity to tell the story of the Jordan River crossing. The pile of rocks not only served as an opportunity to tell the Jordan River crossing but also the crossing of the Red Sea.

The purpose of telling both stories was the same. God wanted all the people of the earth to know that He is mighty. He also wanted His people to fear Him.

Pile 1

When entering the Promised Land God used each story of the conquest to build on the previous one. As each story was added, the people in the land of Canaan became increasingly more fearful of God's people. In between the victory over Jericho and Ai, God's people suffered a defeat. The defeat was caused by Achan's sin. He took some items from Jericho that God had forbidden. The people carried out God's punishment of Achan by stoning him and his entire family. Once the stoning was complete, they covered him with a large pile of rocks. That pile of rocks remained there for many years.

Pile 2

After defeating the people of Ai, Joshua hung the king and allowed his body to remain on the tree until evening. When he took the king's body down, he cast it at the gate of the city and covered it with rocks. The rocks were a reminder for many generations of how God defeated the people of Ai.

Pile 3

After defeating the five kings who had taken refuge in a cave, Joshua hung them on a tree and allowed their bodies to remain there until evening. Joshua ordered their lifeless bodies off the tree and back into the cave. He then instructed his soldiers to roll large stones against the mouth of the cave. The three previous stories each end with the statement that the piles of rocks 'remain until this day.' They remained for years as a reminder of the story that put them there.

The replica of the altar

Another story that shows the important role monuments play in generational success is the altar built by the Reubenites, Gadites, and half of the tribe of Manasseh. They built that altar so future generations would remember that they participated in the conquering of the land. It was their way of making sure their part in the story was passed down from generation to generation. They were motivated by some powerful things, including ensuring that their offspring would not be accused of forsaking God. They feared the tribes on the west side of the Jordan would forget to tell their children the role those dwelling on the east side played in the conquest. The altar was their insurance policy.

Ebenezer: the stone of help

The Ark of the Covenant had been in storage for twenty-three years. The Philistines were afflicting God's people. The Israelites had had all they could take. They cried out to Samuel for help. Samuel instructed them to get rid of all their idols and to only worship the God of their fathers. They agreed to do just that. They separated themselves from Baal and joined themselves to the almighty God. During this cleansing process they gathered together at Mizpah where they confessed their sins and fasted for a day. The Philistines saw this and assumed it was an act of war.


God's people were afraid. They begged Samuel to keep praying to the God of Heaven for their deliverance. Samuel took a young lamb and offered it to God as a sacrifice. God heard and answered Samuel's prayer. As the Philistines gathered together for war, God 'thundered with a loud thunder' against them, causing confusion and panic. God's people pursued and with little effort drove them away. They also took back some of the cities the Philistines had conquered.

At the end of the battle Samuel took a rock and placed it between Mizpah and Shen and called it Ebenezer and said, "Thus far the Lord has helped us." The Philistines didn't come into Israel's territory because the hand of the Lord was against the Philistines all the days of Samuel. In addition, there was peace between the Israelites and the Amorites. The stone set up by Samuel was a constant reminder of this incredible story.

Mark 15:24-39 24 And when they crucified Him, they divided His garments, casting lots for them to determine what every man should take. 25 Now it was the third hour, and they crucified Him. ... 29 And those who passed by blasphemed Him, wagging their heads and saying, "Aha!
